From Clements the Rev. W. M. Godfrey has forwarded the sum of £1 2s. 10½d.; but the Committee are without any particulars of the formation of a Local Committee in that Parish.

The Committee of St. George's, Cape Breton, to whose meeting allusion has already been made, has remitted the sum of £20.

From the Liverpaol Local Committee, S. P. Fairbanks, Esq. the delegate of the present meeting, has paid in the sum of £17.

The Guysboro' Committee, one of the most punctual of our branches, has forwarded the sum of £9 0s. 8½d.; with a request that £1 13s. 9d., might be applied in aid of efforts for the conversion of the heathen.

The Digby Committee, whose formation under such favourable auspices has already been referred to, has made a remittance of £13: a sum less than was stated to be the amount of annual contributions, because most of the subscriptions are made payable quarterly.
