July 23—Steamship Belle Brown left the Wolves" at 2 a.m., and arrived at Eastport at 4 o'clock. From the baggae-master of the New England the following particulars are obtained: Steamer New England left St. John at her assultime, and made Point Lepreaux, and heard the bell of the lighthouse. She struck the Eistern Wolf, some ten miles from Head harbor light and fifteen miles from Eastport, at 11 o'clock, about two hours before high water. She remained there over an hour. In that time every one had an o pnortunity to work and save what they could. Frederic E Nutt, of the Eistern Express, was on board and saved all his money and papers and packages, even to some boxes of fosh salmon, though the latter were cooked and eaten by the passengers after being taken assore. The clerk of the steamer saved his money and papers. The most of the bedding and furniture, except what was in the cibin, was saved. It was berfeelly calm at the time, tough the fog was very dense, so much so that they ould not see twenty feet from the Stame. There was two feet of water on the Wolf.—Twice they made two revolutions to back her. There was two feet of water on the Wolf.—Twice they made two revolutions to back her. They were going about twelve knots at the time, Five feet more would have cleared the rock. When she struck she keeled over so the water went into the after gangway. She then began to settle aft. The metallio boats proved the best. The wooden boat was stove on the rock. She turned over at high water on Tu-sday, and is all covered with water, except her keel. There is no doubt about her being a total loss. There was no panic and no one frightened. Good order was maintained. All the officers and men worked well, and the passengers rendered all the assistance they could. Had it been rough or storms and no me minute after they saw the rock till they struck.
