ASKING GOVT. HELP TO REGAIN TRADE

Coal Men of Cape Breton See Chance For Business.

SYDNEY, N. S., March 28.—An urgent demand that the Federal Government take steps to bring about relief to the coal trade in Cape Breton was contained in a message sent by the Sydney Board of Trade tonight to J. C. Douglas, M. P. for Cape Breton South and Richmond. The message set forth that vessels of the Canadian Government merchant marine now lying idle at Halifax might be turned over to the Dominion Coal Company for use in the South American coal trade. This market was lost to the Dominion Coal Company during the war, but with additional shipping an effort could be put forth to regain it.

Mr. Douglas was requested to bring the matter before the Government immediately.

GALE AT BOSTON.

BOSTON, March 28.—An unscheduled visit of summer, which carried the temperature from a minimum of 48 last night to a maximum of 73 this afternoon, came to a sudden end and in a smart thundershower tonight. At 10 p.m. the thermometer registered 42, with indications that it would show a much lower mark before morning. The drop was accompanied by a northwest gale.

DEBATES

AT THE ALLEN.

Capacity audiences filled Allen Theatre at the initial performance of "The Woman in His House," and judge from the interest aroused by this film, the rest of the run will be just as successful.

This delightful drama illustrates the sublime power of a mother's love in casting off evil and restoring good. The story, in brief, is as follows: Philip Emerson, a materialistic physician, marries a beautiful young girl, Hilda, whom he had met while spending a holiday on the northern coast. He takes her to his home in New York, but because so engrossed in medical science that he neglects his wife. Circumstances put groundless jealousy in the heart of Hilda, and when a tempter comes along she leaves with him, abandoning her little child, whom she afterwards hears has died during an epidemic. But the child is not dead, although the doctors say he will be hopelessly deformed. How, through Peter Martin, a true friend of Philip, his wife returns to her home, and how the little boy is restored to health by a miracle of love, must be seen to be adequately realized.

The role of Hilda finds powerful portrayal in the hands of Mildred Harris, who ably abates the ordinary. It is staged by a man and a woman appearing under the name of Paul and Pauline. The two actresses give a remarkable exhibition of strength.

Eugene Emmett, an Irishman with a silvery tender voice, sings some of his own sweet Irish songs and ballads. One rarely hears such a voice as his in vaudeville. Perhaps one of the most wholesome but downright funny acts ever staged locally was staged by two young men, Bryant and Stuart. The two attempted nothing but a play on words, and they were so absolutely foolish that the crowd almost refused to let them go.

The fashion review is a wondrous display of gowns, wraps and suits paraded before the admiring gaze of the spectators by five gorgeous models. The effecting some rapid changes the models each appeared several times, each time costumed differently.

ALLEGED FORGER HAS MADE CONFESSION

Sidney Bedford Arrested While Trying To Pass \$1,000 Check.

WINDSOR, March 28.—Sidney Bedford, aged 29, who was arrested on a charge of forging checks on a bank, has confessed, according to members of the Walkerville police force. Bedford was arrested while in the act of trying to pass a check for \$1,000, at a branch of the Merchants Bank in Walkerville. He is alleged to have secured \$700 in operations in Walkerville before his arrest.

On a charge of carrying a weapon, William Tillard, found guilty in police court this afternoon and remanded for sentence. Tillard, according to evidence, entered a restaurant with two companions and began shooting up the place.

MUNICIPALITIES MAY PURCHASE RAILWAY

Sending Delegation To Ottawa To Ask For Permission.

THOROLD, March 28.—At the annual meeting here today of the Niagara District Hydro Radial Union a resolution was passed asking the Niagara district municipalities interested in the operation of the Niagara, St. Catharines and Toronto Railway, to negotiate directly for the purchase of the assets of the railway, independent of the usual guarantee given by the province of Ontario, subject to the approval of the ratepayers interested. This would mean that whether the Ontario hydro-electric power commission's radial projects go through or not, the Niagara district will have its own public-owned railway. It is understood that in any event, if the municipalities buy the railway they will request the Ontario hydro commission to run it for them. T. J. Lanigan, secretary of the Ontario Hydro Radial Association, declared that notwithstanding that the probe of the hydro-electric radial railway schemes had dragged along seven months, and that many varieties of experts had been heard thereat, the municipalities asking for hydro radials still had faith in them. He expressed a hope that some construction of the radial railways would be begun this year.

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LILLIAN GISH IN 'WAY DOWN EAST' SECOND BERNHARDT
