**Fifth Death in one family**  
 The three-year-old daughter of Mrs. Henry Oliver died yesterday from influenza making the fifth member of the family claimed by the disease within two weeks. The child's father died four days ago, and the mother is seriously ill.

**Holding Debentures Off**  
 City debentures are being held off the market by City Treasurer A.K. Binnell of Brantford who is of the opinion that shortly the long-term debentures will be in greater demand and at a lower rate of interest.

**To Build Big Dry Dock.**  
 Supt. A.R. Morrison of the Foundation Company Port Huron, says that the company is making ready for the construction of what will be one of the largest drydocks on the Great Lakes. It will be 650 feet long and will have sufficient depth and breadth to accommodate the largest boats on the lakes. A wharf 1,100 feet long is now under construction for boats which will moor at the plant.

**Finds Shooting Deliberate**  
 A jury that investigated the death of Walter Krysk Hamilton who was fatally shot on December 29, brought in a verdict "that the deceased came to his death from a shot from a revolver in the hands of Tony Chernesky and we find that the act was deliberate." Chernesky made his escape and has not been arrested.

It is reported that the police have solved the mystery of the murder of the young Hamilton, who was fatally shot on New Year's Day beside 105 Hess street north Hamilton. The inquest will be held tonight and the police claim that they know who the murderer is and will divulge his name at the inquest.

**You as in Trouble.**  
 On charges ranging from chicken stealing to attempted safe-blowing, six youths are under arrest at Windsor. They were apprehended by Detectives Reid and Broderick following an unsuccessful attempt to rob the safe of Cook Bros. feed merchants Pitt street east. The suspects are Lawrence, Petreux, Ralph Vanderinder, John Tillard, Patrick Chevalier, Roy Meredith and Raymond Langlois.

According to the police, Meridith, Tillard and Chevalier have confessed to making an attempt to dynamite the safe of Cook Bros. They were unsuccessful, they told the police because their drilling machine failed to work. The boys are also suspected of blowing the safe in the department store of the C.H. Smith Company, Pitt street east, Windsor three weeks ago.


