## Effort to Shield Some Profiteers is Charged

MR. PRINGLE, COUNSEL FOR  
COST OF LIVING COMMITTEE  
SPEAKS PLAINLY

OTTAWA, June 24.—There was a  
lively row in the cost-of-living com-  
mittee of the Commons this afternoon  
and for a time it looked as if the  
proceedings of that body would  
terminate abruptly, but eventually  
an armed peace was restored and re-  
solvedly the committee, and H.H.  
McLean of the Harris Abattoir Com-  
pany, was continued.

The trouble developed over the  
examination by Mr. Pringle,  
counsel for the committee, and H.H.  
Stevens M.P., into the capitalization  
of the Harris company. Early in  
the sitting Mr. McLean had stated  
that the capital stock of the com-  
pany was \$2,000,000, all common  
stock and paid up. On this statement  
the net profits of the company in  
the financial year ending March  
31, 1918, were \$522,014, or about  
26 per cent. Later it developed  
that the original capital 19 years ago  
was \$150,000, that when the war  
started it was \$880,000, and this  
was increased to \$2,000,000 in Sep-  
tember of last year.

Mrs. Pringle, says Mr. Pringle.  
"I have been misled as to these  
statements," said Mr. Pringle. "Be-  
lieving that the capital was two mil-  
lions, I asked if the net profits were  
\$522,014 for the year ending March 31,  
1918. I asked if that represented  
26.10 per cent. You acquiesced. As  
a matter of fact your capital was  
\$880,000 and your earnings 61 per  
cent. That was a little misleading  
and I don't like it."

Mr. Stevens stated that what  
has impressed itself on his mind every  
day is that some companies started  
with a certain capital, after a few  
years they found they had made high  
profits, they capitalized these profits  
and figured that they must be al-  
lowed by the public profits on both  
their capitalization on their accumu-  
lated profits.

"This country is going on with a  
system of financing," he said, "which  
cannot continue. We are getting to  
the apex. Something has got to  
break. This country cannot bear  
it. These things ought to be frankly  
faced. Mr. Stevens stated that his com-  
pany's business was done on 1 to 2 1/2  
per cent on the turnover, or a quarter  
of a cent per pound.

Mr. Stevens: "That's the story we  
get from everybody."  
Mr. Davis remarked that this firm  
had been in business for 19 years and  
now they had got 20 times the origi-  
nal capital.

He drew from the witness that  
since the \$150,000 had been put in  
to the extent of \$2,000,000.  
Mr. McLean urged that the pro-  
ceedings were entitled to the  
gratitude of the public instead of  
abuse. On 100,000,000 pounds of  
frozen meat one year the profit was  
only one-quarter of a cent a pound.  
He thought that was very little for  
the consumer to pay.

"Yes," said Mr. Davis, "but he's  
getting it from all angles."
