TWEEDIE, LEMUEL J. (*Northumberland.*)

Of Irish extraction, father being a native of Leitrim and mother of Down, Ireland. B. at Chatham, N.B., 30 Nov., 1849. Ed. at County Grammar Sch., and at Presbyterian Academy. M., 6 Dec., 1876, Agnes, dau. of late Alex. Loudoun, Chatham. Called to the bar, N.B., 1871. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g.e. 1874; an unsuccessful candidate at g.e. 1878; re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal-Conservative.—*Chatham, N.B.*

WHITE, ALBERT SCOTT, LL.B. (*King's.*)

Great grandf., William White, was a U.E. Loyalist, who settled in Queen's Co. and lived to be a centenarian. S. of J. E. White, a retired merchant of St. John. B. at Sussex, 12 April, 1866. Ed. at Varley Sch. and at Wesleyan Academy and Coll., Sackville, graduating B.A. at the last and LL.B. at Harvard, June 1877. Is a practising Barrister and a Governor of Univ. of Mount Allison. First returned to House of Assem., at last g.e. A Liberal-Conservative.—*Sussex, N.B.*

WILSON, WILLIAM. (*York.*)

S. of William Wilson, a native of Donegal, Irel., who came to N.B. in 1825, and m. Maria, dau. of Richard Pugh. B. in Parish of Douglas, 2 June, 1845, and ed. at District Sch., and subsequently at the Baptist Seminary, Fredericton. Graduated B.A. at Univ. of N.B. 1873, and took the Douglas Gold Medal 1872. M., July, 1879, Jessie, dau. of Alexander Thompson, of Douglas. Called to the Bar. N. B., 1876. Has been Grand Master of the Orange Assoc. of N.B.; a County Councillor; mem. of City Council of Fredericton; Clerk of York County Courts, and Clerk of the Peace for York, and is now Sec. Treas. for York. First returned to Ho. of Assem., July 1885, on the sitting mem., Mr. Thompson, being apptd. to L.C., and re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Fredericton, N.B.*
