On motion of the Honorable Mr. Mackenzie, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Dorion, Ordered, That the Bill from the Senate, intituled: "An Act further to continue for a limited time 'The Insolvent Act of 1869,' and the Acts amending the same" be now read the first time.

The Bill was accordingly read the first time.

Ordered, That the Bill be now read a second time.

The Bill was accordingly read a second time.

Ordered, That the Bill be now read the third time.

The Bill was accordingly read the third time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. *Dorion*, seconded by the Honorable Mr. *Mackenzie*, the Title of the Bill was amended by adding at the end thereof the words, "and for other purposes."

Resolved, That the Bill do pass.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry back the Bill to the Senate, and acquaint their Honors, That this House hath passed the same, with an amendment, to which they desire their concurrence.

Mr. Casey, from the Select Committee appointed to enquire into the condition of Port Stanley Harbor (Ontario) at the time it was transferred to Trustees for the London and Port Stanley Railway Company, the subsequent management of the affairs of the said Harbor, including the collection and disposition of Tolls, and the receipt and expenditure of all other funds; and the present condition and requirements of the said Harbor, presented to the House the Report of the said Committee, which was read.
