



Assault man fined

MISSISSAUGA — A Klenberg man who tried to seduce a friend's babysitter was fined \$200 on 30 days in jail last week and told by the judge he came very close to a much more serious charge.

Lan Fairley, 22, went to his friend's house at 1438 Burnhamthorpe Rd. where he knew a 25-year-old woman was babysitting. He entered the house and attempted to seduce her. When she rebuffed his advances he became angry and tried to remove her sweater.

The woman ran to the telephone and called the police who subsequently charged Fairley with indecent assault. The charge was later changed to common assault.

Fairley's lawyer claimed he was drunk at the time and was very sorry for the unfortunate occurrence.

NO MORE CHANCES

town studies road costs

PORT CREDIT — After six years of road reconstruction in Port Credit, with only one more area yet to be widened and repaved, town council decided Monday to find out the comparative costs of laying 24-foot-wide roads instead of the present 28-foot-wide roads.

The motion, proposed by Councillor John Caldwell, was approved with only one dissenting vote from Ed Donner, roads committee chairman.

"The town should have done this long ago," Reeve Frank Leavers said. "We could have saved a lot of money and argument back when the road program started."

Caldwell explained the motion as a move to discover the right answers to questions the public has put to council in the last few months. Several delegations have appeared to oppose the road widening and paving program in Area 2. Their opposition stemmed from fear of increased traffic at the end to the area's "burban charm".

Orders for Area F were issued on May 8 with the congoing to Warren Bitum-Ltd. with a low bid of \$7 for the 1.2 miles of the south-east corner town.

Caldwell said Monday, the public "had a right to know". "When these come to us we should have the answers." The deputy-reve called for more public involvement in the decision-making process.

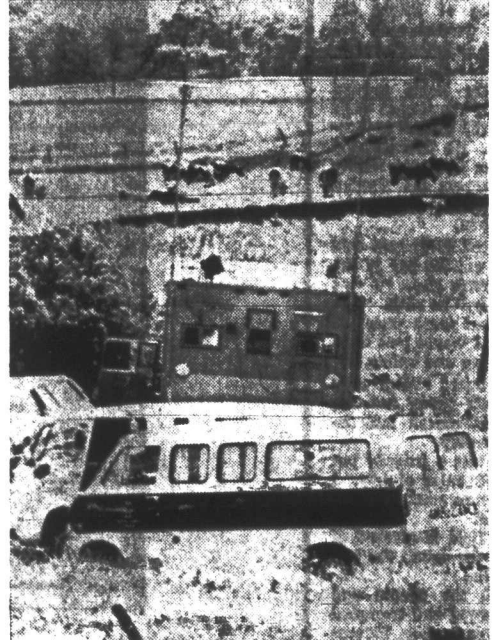
Mayor Cy Saddington seemed dubious. "An example of what you get with participatory democracy is the Spadina Expressway issue in Toronto," he said.
