

Regulations for the appointment of Pound Keepers defining their duties, regulating the fees to be paid them in the Peynis Indian Reserve.

- 1st Every pound-keeper appointed shall take charge of all animals taken up for trespass or as strays, and shall be responsible for their custody, and shall collect all damages and charges for keep & other incidental expenses, before delivering up the animal to the owner.
- 2nd It shall be the duty of each pound-keeper appointed under said regulation to provide a suitable stable & yard for the proper & safe keeping of all animals impounded therein and to feed & take proper care of the same.
- 3rd It shall be the duty of the pound-keeper immediately to inform the owner of any animal impounded, of the fact, or if the owner be not known, to post up notices, in at least three of the most conspicuous places in the reserve, provided the value of the animal does not exceed \$15⁰⁰, but if the animal impounded exceeds \$15⁰⁰, then the pound-keeper shall immediately advertise the same in a local newspaper, three successive issues, giving as near as possible, all the marks natural & artificial, colour & probable age, and if after expiration of thirty days, as regards horned cattle, horses, or mules; and in the case of sheep & pigs ten days from the date of the first notice or advertisement, no owner being found the pound-keeper shall advertise the sale of the said animal by public auction, by posting notices in three of the most public places in the reserve, giving at least one week's notice of the sale.
