

that the defendant O'Sullivan had unlawfully refused to have that borrage made amicably, and through his refusal, and contention about the Fletcher borrage, which he has been unable to prove, had made the judicial proceedings against him necessary, adjudged that the said O'Sullivan should pay the costs of said action.

3. In the case of Regina vs Picard et al. the Court adopted the Report of the Surveyors appointed, and rendered Judgment according to said Report; and boundary stones have also to be placed.
