place as he may consider to be best in the interests of the Indians, the purchaser of the burnt, fallen and dried timber to be required to furnish satisfactory quarantees that he will make advances of supplies, from time to time, to the Indians, operating under a license to be issued to them by the Department to enable them to cut the dead, burnt and fallen timber.

Mr. Visiting Indian Superintendent Phipps has been instructed to also make such additional stipulations with the purchaser as he may consider advisable.
