Ottawa, April 13, 1920.

Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 7th instant, informing the Department that the Chief and Councillors of The Pas Reserve request the re-appointment of Robert Thomas as teacher at The Pas Day School.

In reply I beg to confirm the following night letter of yesterday's date,- "Reappointment Robert Thomas as teacher Pas Day School approved. Salary five hundred dollars and bonus if continued".

The Department has, upon your report that this man has given his promise to the Indians and yourself that his conduct in future will be satisfactory, decided to re-appoint him. His retention in the position will, however, depend entirely upon the success with which he meets in his work and the way in which he conducts himself upon the reserve. Any further breach of sobriety will lead to his dismissal, and you will be good enough to inform him accordingly.

His salary will be at the rate of \$500.00 per annum and the bonus, if it is continued to teachers in Indian day schools during the present fiscal year. The continuance of the bonus will depend upon the action taken by the present session of Parliament.
