Do you recognize this poster as a sample of what was to be printed by Mr. Blais and will you produce it to the Court?
- A.152 Yes, Sir.
- Q. 153 Poster, signed by the President is annexed to the proceedings. See document marked "p".
And advertising what Company?
- A. 153 Salome Industries Regd.
- Q. 154 And in what name did you carry out these transactions?
- A. 154 In my own name.
- Q. 155 What name did you use at the time of your desertion?
- A. 155 My own name.
- Q. 156 What address?
- A. 156 1467 Joliette St.
- Q. 157 What was your dress?
- A. 157 Uniform all the time.
- Q. 158 Did you understand the meaning of the charge desertion? Will you explain it to me?
- A. 158 Well, desertion means when somebody goes away from the Army and he has no intention to come back.
- Q. 159 That would apply to you. Would that description apply to you?
- A. 159 No, Sir.
