So S Incorres was made use of by the Indiana every season. On Kilitable wiver the Tribe had two or three houses; the Indiano sent therejte dry salmon and also uped this recorve es, a benting ground. Those was some closered ground there there a for petatoon were grown. There was no cultivation at all on No S. The Indiana had a little house there which was need in semmon during the fishing season. On the big Reserve there were little gardens about. Then the people miking those gurdens died, the gardens were abandoned. There 10 was marked "good soil" on the map there was or had been some little cultivation. The greater part of the Recorve was not good soil; it overfowed with water on the northern side and therefore was of no use to suyone but the Indians, who used it for hunting. The unter came in from the west side of the lake and flooded the northerly part of the Reserve. Other fishing stations along the inlet and the lake were eccupied by the Indians and used by them for many years.

To the Chairman: On Kildshin river the land was used in patches for nearly a mile perhaps. For half a mile the land consisted of a flat covered with unter during part of the year. There was a strip of about half a mile long on this flot that had been spannedically cultivated, back from the river. There was only about half a mile square in the reserve that was fit for cultivation. The Indians could make gardens and grow things only in a very narrow strip along the river on the main Reserve. The rest of the land there was all recky, succepy or covered with twisted healook. It was possible of cultivation only is spots. Some of the Indiana had little gardens off the reserves, up by the Lake. He attempt at any systematic-ouldivation of the land had ever been male. These Judians had no horses, sattle, sheep or fool. They emed three guardine Launches, treive round-betten Colmbia river motel fishing beats and about a donor concer. The bettens unto their living chiefly by fishing, busting and
