SEC. 2. Clearance and Traveling Cards. - Clearance and next meeting, at raveling Cards of the form prescribed by the Grand Lodge, d bearing its seal and the signature of the Grand Secretary all be granted to members applying for them, if they are clear om all charges. In cases where a member act in a wilfully fensive manner, a Lodge shall have the power to present him ith a Clearance Card, even when he has not applied for one, pon a five-sixths vote of the Lodge; provided the Lodge has dered by a vote that written notice of such action be sent to very member (including reason for such action to the member whom the card is to be given) one week prior to such vote eing taken; and, upon presentation of the Clearance Card, tembership in that Lodge shall cease, the right of appeal, how ver, remaining. Such Clearance Card to state that it was ranted without application by a five-sixths vote of the Subordiate Lodge. A Clearance Card shall be valid until revoked by he Lodge issuing the same, except in case of the surrender or evocation of the charter of such Lodge. A Travelling Card hall be valid for the time for which payment of dues shall be nade in advance, not exceeding one year.

SEC. 3. Effect of Cards,—Members holding cards granted by his Lodge are still members of the Order, and subject to the urisdiction of this Lodge.

Traveling Card Members.—Any member desiring SEC. 4. o visit this Lodge on a traveling card shall be examined in the inte-room, and shall not be admitted unless he proves himself In the Traveling Password and the work of the degree in which the Lodge is open.
