Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, excepting 8 and 20, which has not been home-steaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purpose, may be homesteaded upon by any perton who is the sole head of a family, or any maile over 18 years of age, to the extent of one quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

BNTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is atimate, or if the homestender desiros, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Com-missioner of Immigration, Winnibeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is gituate, receive authority for some one to make estry for him. A fee ed \$1000 is charged for a homestend entry. HOMESTBAD DUTIES,

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:-

the following plans:-(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years. (2) If the father for mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is eligible to make a homested entry under the provisions of the Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to resi-dence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother. (3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtain-ing patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead. the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead. (4) If the satisfies he is in resmanant residence upon farming land

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town, township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (3) or (4) must cultivate 80 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those sottlers only who completed the duthes upon their first homesteads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1880. Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to ave his entry cancelled, and the land may be again throw open for entry. APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be mc.de at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Tappector. Before making application for patent, the settler must give air months' notice in writing to the Com-missioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention to d' so. INFORMATION.
