# EDITORIAL NOTES.

Mr. A. E. Milligan, Lawrence Station, Charlotte county, N. B., writes some kindly words regarding this paper, and adds the following interesting intelligence :- "Petitions are now being circulated by the rumsellers and their agents, asking for a vote to be taken on the Scott Act with a view to repealing it and adopting the License Law of last winter. These agents get ten cents for every name they are able to get on the petition. The general opinion among temerance men, however, is that the Scott Act will be sustained, although not by a very large majority.'

At a recent meeting the Toronto Branch of the Dominion Alliance decided to bring out temperance candidates for aldermen at the next civic elections. Practical work of this nature, bearing directly upon the body politic, is a most powerful means of awakening the public to its responsibility in respect to the liquor traffic, besides being useful in compelling electors to show where they stand upon the temperance question.
