The sum of £50 towards completing the road from Frog Pond to the Lower Loch Lomond.

The sum of £35 for continuing the road over the first Thoroughfare to the

third Lake.

The sum of £25 for improving the road from Tabor's farm, on Hammond river, to Quaco...

The sum of £30 for improving the road from Loch-Lomond to Quaco.

CHARLOTTE.

The sum of £15 towards opening the road from the Pennfield settlement, near Hand's farm, to the St. John road.

The sum of £90 for the road from the second Falls, at Magaguadavic, to the

Fredericton road.

NORTHUMBERLAND.

The sum of £175 to explore, lay out, and open a road from the river Nepisiguit to the river Restigouche.

"The Council have agreed to the resolutions of appropriation sent up by the Assembly, dated 8th and 10th March, excepting the following:---

To Warren Hatheway, £22:10.

To Christopher Scott, £137: 15:9.

"The Council have also resolved, that the appropriation to Warren Hathe"way, be taken into consideration at the next Session of the General Assem"bly."

And then Mr. Black withdrew.

Resolved that the resolutions of appropriation for Great Roads of the 8th instant, be rescinded.

A Message from the Council.

Mr. Attorney-General delivered the Message, as follows:---

for the encouragement of the School on the Madras System of Education.

To Ebenezer Smith, the sum of £5:5, now in his hands, as a remuneration for twelve day's actual labour performed by him.

And then Mr. Attorney-General withdrew.

Mr. Street attended, pursuant to the order of the House of yesterday; and

being called in and examined, was directed to withdraw.

Ordered that Mr. Street furnish at the next Session of the General Assembly, a general account of monies expended by him on the Burton causeway, including his charge for superintendance.
