

LAND REGULATIONS.

THE sole head of a family, or any n Quarter section of available Dominion in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. plicant must appear in person at the minion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency the District. Entry by proxy may be m at any Dominion Lands Agency (but Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Duties-Six months' residence upon cultivation of the land in each of th years. A homesteader may live with aline miles of his homestead on a farm of least 80 acres, on certain conditions. habitable house is required except where the residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in go at anding may pre-empt a quarter-sect along-side his homestead. Price \$3.00 acre

Duties—Six months' residence in each thre; years after earning homestead rent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. I emption patent may be obtained as soon homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his hor stead right may take a purchased hor stead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 acre. Duties—must reside six months each of three years, cultivate 50 acres a crect a house worth \$300.
