### A GARDEN OF EDEN.

Told By An Explorer. Interesting facts about an almost known race were related before the

He made a long journey last winter to the Victoria Nyanza, to investigate, on behalf of the British Museum, some Miocene deposits near Karungu, on the east coast of the lake. For five weeks he lived among natives in a district five days' distant from the nearest white man. The natives belonged, he said, to the Jalwo Kavirondo, a race of Nilotic negroes (with noticeable admixture of Hamitic blood) remarkable for their nudity and their uiter lack 11r. No bit of iron came amiss to the Kavirondo men, and they even twisted wire into large spectacle frames in imitation of European travelers. On the whole, said Mr. Oswald, this race of hardy herdsmen, tending humped cattle, fat-tailed sheep and goets, shared the burden of life fairly equally, but water-carrying fell exclusively upon the women and was never undertaken by the men who were, however, not above carrying heavy burdens of papyrus stems and grass for building their round huts and wood for fires and fences, and they would join the women in tilling their fields of millet. warmly to grateful smiles.
