The prosecutor with difficulty made himself heard in the tumult which ensued, and demanded the prompt punishment of M. Deroulede, who continued to harlinsults at the high court, coupled with the assertion that he desired punishment. The session was eventually suspended and the court retired to consider the situation. They decided to impose a sentence of two years imprisonment on Derastlede for libelling senators.
