"The partial cost of the survey of the St. John valley for a railway, \$19,290, is not included in the ordinary expenditure. This will have to be charged somewhere, and it seems reasonable that out of the magnificent revenues afforded the present government a little ordinary care in the management of affairs would have provided for this amount out of revenue without making a loan. & Railway repairs.


