Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a fam-ily, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency of the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

In certain conditions a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to erect homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted the homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$10.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.

GHOST STORY.

A Suit Brought Against the Toronto World.

Toronto, Oct. 14.—Whether real or imaginary, ghosts have the power, in the minds of some people, to depreciate the value of property is a question that the court has been asked to decide. Because the Toronto World published, about a year ago, a ghost story in connection with a house on Pape avenue, Mr. Mark Maynard, builder, is bringing suit for unstated damages to his property against that newspaper. The plaintiff stated yesterday in the witness box of the Jury Assizes, before Mr. Justice Britton, that as a result of the publication the value of his property had depreciated, and that he had been unable to sell it. Crowds of people had visited his place out of pure curiosity after having read the story, and he had been unable to keep them off his premises. His wife had in consequence suffered much in health. The story that was published was absolutely false.

The defence argued that the article in question was a purely imaginary and fictitious story, written solely for the purpose of amusing and edifying the readers of the World, with no intention of injuring any property whatever. The story was in effect that the house was haunted.

Evidence was taken, and the addresses of the counsels to the jury were delivered yesterday, but the case was adjourned till this morning, when the Judge will give his charge.
