GREAT RAILWAY STRIKE.

600,000 Men Out in England -- Land Transportation Paralyzed-- Aeroplane Mail Service Inaugurated--Warning Against Wooden Houses--Wilson Threatens to Boycott Italy.

AGREEMENT IMPOSSIBLE.

LONDON, Sept. 26. According to the Evening Standard the Government, during the conference with the Railway Union leaders, made an offer for the continuation of present wages throughout this year and into next year until the cost of food now reckoned at 115 per cent. above the pre-war scale had fallen to 110 per cent. above the pre-war level, and remained there or below that point for a three months' period. Owing to the uncompromising attitude of the men, however, the Standard adds, an agreement was found to be impossible.

At midnight the strike will affect probably more than six hundred thousand men. The Government has arranged to have the mails carried by airplanes and to have large motor cars from Government services made available for conveyance of supplies to big towns which will be seriously affected. The locomotive engineers have announced that they will join in strike, but it is stated that the Government has arranged to have many men who drove engines during the war make runs on principal train service routes. An official announcement from Downing Street on the breakdown of negotiations with the railway men reads: "Conference failed to arrive at an agreement and the strike will take place to-night."

BEN. TILLET'S OPINION.

HAMILTON, ONT., Sept. 26. Ben Tillet, M.P., the British labor leader who is here attending the Dominion Trades and Labor Congress, as fraternal delegate, in discussing the cause of the railway crisis in England, said to-day: "The root cause of the trouble lies in what is considered a monstrous conspiracy between the railways in collusion with the Govt. to maintain an impossible condition of living for the workers. The railways, I believe, welcome the responsibility of a strike, as this would relieve them of their pension obligations to their old employees."

STATESMANLIKE.

CAPE TOWN, Sept. 26. (Reuter's)—Premier Smuts has started a tour of the northwestern Cape Province and has met with an enthusiastic welcome at Victoria West. His address was a popular appeal along the lines of his address at the Assembly recently when he exhorted South Africa to come together and the white races to more closely unite. "Our white population in South Africa," he stated, "is too small to be divided." He also urged more toleration, more conciliation, and more brotherly love. The Premier laid emphasis on South Africa's immense potentialities which he claimed made it the richest mining country in the world. He said "There is one continuous coal field here and in Rhodesia which will not be exhausted in a thousand years and in the long run will prove more valuable than gold or diamonds. Premier Smuts uttered a warning against too much politics and appealed for a new spirit in the development of a greater united South Africa. The meeting terminated with the singing of the National Anthem amidst scenes of enthusiasm and an ovation for the Premier."

HIGH PLANE NEARING COMPLETION.

LONDON, Sept. 26. (Reuter's)—The Times issued illustrations showing the progress in building the R-80, which is now almost complete. It embodies in every way the latest British ideas. The car lighter, more spacious and of greater utility than any previous engine, and are expected to overcome the difficulty experienced in earlier ships where motor power was supplied by airplane engines.

WARNING SERVED.

LONDON, Sept. 26. (Reuter's)—The Daily Chronicle in an editorial headed "Wooden Houses," warns against too rosy expectations and points out that the wood is both scarce and dear and is likely to become more so if there is a big demand for wooden houses. The Chronicle hopes that building operations will not be diverted from sound enduring work by a temptation to escape on quick easy terms from an embarrassing responsibility. 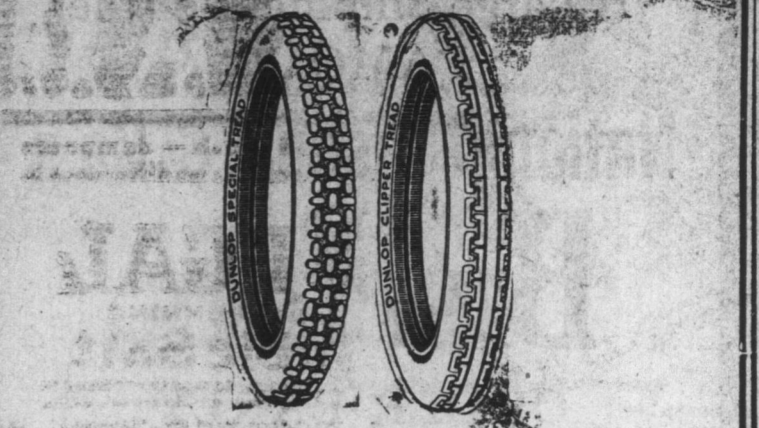
