and to demand that the infected areas should be made as small as possible consistent with safety, that the English ports should be opened to Irish live stock under the conditions which were in operation 28 years ago, and that Irish ports, such as Cork and Waterford, which are 150 miles from any centre of disease, should be free from all restrictions.

Mr. W. Field, M. P., who presided, said that owing to the existing restrictions the prices of cattle had fellen. Unless fat cattle could be removed from the pastures the men who bought cattle to fatten would be unable to purchase stores. The money involved in the fat cattle trade amounted to \$22,500,000, and in the store cettle trade to \$55,000,000. There
