TRUSKEY TALKS.

Sorry that His Brother-in-Law, Taylor, Still Lives.

Three Years, He Thinks, Would be

Ample Punishment for the Crime. WINDSOR, Oct. 3.-For the first time since Joseph Truskey was convicted of the murder of Constable Lindsay at Comber. on May 3 last, and was sentenced to hang at Sandwich on the 16th next, he has opened his lips and made a confession, which shows that he contemplated the killing of another man as well, before he put a bullet into himself. Yesterday Truskey sent for Deputy Sheriff Rumble and said that the only thing which troubled him at all was the fact that his brother-in-law, Geo. Taylor, was still alive. 'He was the man I wanted to get at first," said Truskey, "But how I came to shoot

Lindsay before I settled him is more than I know. Truskey expressed himself as not pleased with the attempt made to prove that he was not responsible for the deed, but wishes it understood that he knew well what he was doing. "Had I killed both Lindsay and Taylor," he said," I would be satisfied to go up for five years. But under the circumstances three years is plenty. When I get out I will attend to Taylor, and after serving a few years for that I will settle down, providing no one else meddles

in my affairs."
