# FOREST FIRE IS

Little Hope of Saving Big Crow's Nest Pass Timber Limit.

LETHBRIDGE, Alta., Aug. 31.—With a gale blowing at noon, the forest fire west of Crow's Nest Pass was out of hand in spite of the efforts of hundreds of firefighters. Half the timber limits of the McLaren Lumber Company, which operates at Blairmore, had been destroyed and hope for the remainder had practically been given up.
