a flourishing little community is established at the extreme northwest of Vancouver Island—a community which has practically hewn out a house for itself in the wilderness. The only communication which these settlers have with the the wilderness. The only communica-tion which these settlers have with the outer world is that afforded by a steamer once a month. They are farther out of reach of newspapers, telegraphs and

of reach of newspapers, telegraphs and all the other conveniences of modern life than the people of Dawson—yet they are only about 280 miles from Victoria.

The settlement was formed about five years ago, and numbers about 80 persons of all ages. The heads of families are Danes, most of whom resided for a time in Minnesota and Dakota, which they left in order to secure homes under more agreeable climatic conditions. At Cape Scott they have found a climate very ike that of their native land, though with a somewhat heavier winter rainfall, which suits them to perfection.

These people settled on lands near Cape Scott by an arrangement with Colonel Baker, who was chief commissioner of lands in the Turner administration, the government of that day giving them the benefit of the provisions in the land act relating to colonies. The agreement assured them free crown grants after five years residence and improvement, and they were well satisfied with it. The Semlin government, however, saw fit to abrogate the arrangement so far as it might apply to new settlers coming into the colony, and in consequence progress was considerably checked. As an illustration of their isolated position, so near the capital of British Columbia, and as an argument for better transportation facilities for Vancouver Island, it may be mentioned that they did not get notice of the change in their agreement till six months after it was published in the Official Gazette.
