### THE I. C. R. DISASTER.

The death at Campbellton, the other day, of the third victim of the fatal

derailment of the Ocean Limited at

St. Moise on the Intercolonial section of the National Railways, in the person of the engine driver, naturally directs enquiry as to the cause of the disaster, which, but for the fact that the rear coaches being of steel, remained on the track, would have been attended by a much greater sacrifice of human life. The fact that the disaster was caused by a collision of the train, while running at a high rate of speed, with a sleeping cow on the track, calls forth from a Halifax contemporary the following very reasonable comment: "The law has given to farmers a very large measure

of protection in respect of their live stock by the provision of cattle-guards at railway crossings and in other ways which add to the responsibility and liability of the railways. The protection is afforded under the Railway Act, but the same law requires the farmer to keep his horses and cattle for the purpose of and while crossing the railway in charge of some competent person. There is thus a definite duty imposed upon the owners of cattle under this Act and there is a further provision, under the criminal code, which declares that "everyone

is guilty of an indictable offence and liable to two years' imprisonment who by any unlawful act, or by any wilful omission or neglect of duty, endangers or causes to be endangered the safety of any person conveyed or being in or upon a railway, or aids or assists therein." There is a disposition on the part of persons living along the Intercolonial to look upon the railway as their personal property, and to something to which the laws of the country and the standard principles of railway operation should not apply. When that disposition finds expression in the deliberate disregard of elementary laws for the safety of the travelling public it is time for the authorities, whether Federal or Provincial, or both, to take drastic action.—Quebec Telegraph.

WAR-TAX STAMP TO BE AFFIXED AFTER AUG. 1  
Ottawa, July 24.—According to the post office weekly bulletin on and after August 1, 1922, the war tax stamps to be affixed on money orders issued in Canada will be: Two cents on orders drawn for sums not exceeding \$50; four cents on orders drawn for sums over \$50. The bulletin also states that merchandise liable for customs duty is not to be sent to Belgium in the letter mails.
