CHICAGO, June 23.—The Maitre cross of "Lucy" Baldwin's stable on the back of Jockey VanBuren was borne first past the post today in the American Derby by that steepling, steel-climbed Californian who Ray Santa Anita. The crowd, which was estimated at 100,000, was taken so completely by surprise that it lost its cheering power for a moment and sat mute, but when the name of the winner was carried from mouth to mouth and the blackboard with the figures were hung up over the judges' stand the spectators forgot their disappointments and the pecuniary losses and cheered long and loudly for the crack out of the Santa Anita Stables and his fast time.

Johnson Rides a Trial Mile—Titus Defeats Overbridge.

New York, June 23.—The big race meet at Manhattan Park this afternoon drew a large crowd. Interest chiefly centered in the attempt of Ray McDonald of the Riverside Wheelmen to beat the half mile track record and John S. Johnson to lower the world's mile record on a quarter mile course, and in the mile match race between Fred J. Titus of the Riverside Wheelmen and W. D. Overbridge, champion of Bermuda.
