

pany ever have the money to form the funds? Yes, and much more. In 1887, when the act was passed, it had on hand \$204,000 (of which \$105,000 was debentures), which was to form the nucleus of the reserve. From that time until 1891 it sold \$700,000 of new stock, realising \$1,242,000, of which \$642,000 was for premiums, and it nearly doubled its business. In 1893 alone its total revenue from all sources was \$207,000.

Why were the funds not formed? Because the company wanted bigger profits than the 10 per cent. limit fixed by law. Besides, it preferred to keep the money than to give the company as dividends and salaries are secure it is no concern of the shareholder how much is charged for repairs, and there is a statute empowering the city to buy and the company to sell the whole business—plant, assets, franchises, everything, and authorizing the purchase money to be divided among the shareholders in proportion to their shares. When a sale took place, then would the shareholder realize the equivalent of excessive dividends and a bonus on stock far in excess of the 10 per cent., and this Judge Ferguson calls a "discreetous contrivance," and declares to be unlawful.

What was done with all the money? Sunk in extensive and unnecessary plant and works, and scattered and put under ground.

The Reserve Fund Misled. Why was not the reserve kept intact in debentures instead of being sunk in plant? Because money in plant draws 5 per cent. annually for repairs, and also in case of a sale the plant, however large and unnecessary, would have to be paid for at a valuation; whereas the Reserve, if in debentures, would have to be handed over to the city, and the company would get nothing for it. This holds good with all money sunk in plant.

The company claims it has \$287,000—credit of Repairs Fund. But the truth is it has nothing, having sunk it in plant, and is charging 5 per cent. on it again. It illegally writes off larger sums for depreciation, as well as charging for repairs, last year writing off \$60,000.

The Judgment Explained. What does the judgment of Mr. Justice Ferguson really mean? It is long and complicated, requiring some legal knowledge to fully understand it. Among other things it holds the company guilty of a series of illegal acts, and that it has not complied with the statute 50 Vic, chap. 85, and formed the various funds. It also holds that it is illegal to invest the Reserve in plant, and declares that if invested at all, it must be in debentures.

An example of the company's slight-of-hand bookkeeping may be found in connection with the Reserve, which, were it not so serious for the consumer, would be ludicrous. After the passing of the act the company opened an account in its books called the "Reserve Fund Account," to the credit of which on the 1st Oct., 1894, there stood \$744,000, but instead of having this money on hand, as the entry would lead one to conclude, it only had \$123,000 in debentures, having sunk the balance in plant and its business. The judgment declares this to be no compliance with the act at all, because, to quote the words, "opening the account and making entries in the books thereto is no compliance with the requirements of the act respecting the Reserve or Reserve Fund, except so far as there may be in hand in cash or securities of the kind mentioned in the act."

Queer Tales Yet to be Told. It further relates a number of accounts to be taken covering the company's business since 1887, including receipts from gas rents and premiums, as well as disbursements. The object is to ascertain what should have been the credit of the different funds and where all the money has gone. A very poor enquiry. For aught the public know to the contrary, the money may have percolated into the pockets of the directors and salaries would have been paid just the same. It is apprehended the taking of the accounts will tell some queer tales.
