Launched at the Building yard at Digdegash on the 9th inst. a splendid Barque named the *Madonna*, 570 tons new measurement copper fastened, built for the Hon. James Allanshaw. She is pronounced by competent judges to be the finest vessel ever built in this County.

Launched, at Walker's ship yard on Wednesday last a fine Ship called the *JOHN CAMPBELL*, of 560 tons built for James Rait, Esquire.

Launched on Thursday last, from the ship yard at Chamcook, a fine ship called the *Coronet*, 870 tons [N. M.] copper fastened, built by Mr. R. Townshend, for John Wilson Esquire.

Launched this day, from the same yard a handsome ship called the *Provincialist*, 800 tons [N. M.] copper fastened, built by Messrs. J. & J. Townshend, for Messrs. E. & J. Wilson.

These two splendid ships are said to be the largest ever built in this County, and for beauty of model, superior finish, and strength of build, are not surpassed in the Province.

The news from Mobile is of a most calamitous character, that city has lately been half depopulated by pestilence and is now nearly destroyed by an awful fire which broke out on the 7th inst. and destroyed 400 houses, supposed to be the work of an incendiary.

Several of the U. S. Banks have suspended specie payments. It was commented by the Philadelphia banks, and is followed up in the south, but in New York and Boston they proceed in their business as usual; large amounts of specie were arriving daily in New York.

We regret to notice that an extensive fire occurred at St. John N. F. on the 18th September, which originated in the stores of Messrs. J. Dunscomb & Co. no estimate of the loss of property had been given.
