Trade, if left to itself, uninterfered with (and unobstructed by) rigid tariff, naturally flows, in channels that are most conducive to the interests of all parties concerned.

In no other way can a person get better so large a profit for a very little money, as to expend it in leading what to do, when to do it, and how to do it—in other words, to save his brains help his hands.

During the decade in which the Reciprocity Treaty was in force, our trade with the United States was a time of unprecedented prosperity in these Provinces.

It appears to us, then, that efforts put forth to relieve our trade with the United States of the burdens which it is being felt by both nations, will be more effective in seeking a renewal of amicable reciprocity than in a retaliatory policy of more stringent tariffs.

This nineteenth century, call for consideration by all classes and creeds. It is well known that in the Province of Quebec a very large majority of the electors are Roman Catholics, and a considerable part of those lay adherents to the Roman Church, though strongly and piously attached to it, deny the right of the Clergy to dictate to them in matters purely secular, and especially in the exercise of the elective franchise.

We scrupulously refrain from interference or participation in mere political controversies; but when the electors are threatened with ecclesiastical "pains and penalties" for voting as they deem proper at Elections, and Judges are told that if their interpretation of law is not acceptable to some elevated Church dignitary, they will subject themselves to clerical denunciation and displeasure, we cannot suppress an expression of the indignation we feel, nor fail to exercise our right to animadvert upon unjustifiable tyranny; come from what quarter it may.

There is a generally prevailing impression, says the London correspondent of the N. Y. Tribune, that the Premier will retire at the commencement of the session, that he has induced the Queen to open the Parliament in person in order to give a fine dramatic finishing off to his career.

As regards Russian taxation, the fact remains, writes the Fall Moll Gazette, that the Russian peasant pays very heavily on his land, the Russian noble or member of the Imperial family get almost free.
