TAX STAMPS MUST NOW BE USED

Postage stamps will not be accepted for the war duty on cheques, receipts and bank drafts. Furthermore it is announced by the Post Office Department, the excise stamps for this purpose will not be sold at post offices. This, it is contended, would lead to confusion, as postal matter might be mailed with excise stamps, instead of with the correct postal stamps. The excise stamps are to be sold at banks "and such other places as may be designated by the Department of Customs and Excise." On money orders and postal notes the war tax will continue to be paid by affixing postage stamps.
