

Victor L. Urquidi, born in 1919, is a Mexican economist. A graduate of the London School of Economics, he has had a long career, occupying several posts in financial and banking institutions in Mexico and in the United Nations, as well as in the World Bank. He has taught at the National University of Mexico, as well as at El Colegio de Mexico, where he has been President since 1966. The author of numerous articles and essays in various economic, demographic and other journals, he is co-author of The Economic Development of Mexico, a study published jointly by the Mexican government and the World Bank in 1953. He is also the author of Free trade and Economic Integration in Latin America and The Challenge of Development in Latin America, published in 1962 and 1964, respectively. A member of the executive committee of the Club of Rome since 1972, Mr. Urquidi is also a member of the United Nations Advisory Committee on the Application of Science and Technology to Development.
