How many recruiting officers are there in the R.C.A.F.; (a) with previous service in the R.A.F. in a theatre of war; (b) with previous service in the R.A.F., in England or in Canada; (c) with previous service in the army or navy in any theatre of war; (d) with previous service in the army or navy, but not in a theatre of war; (e) without previous service in the army, navy, or air force?

6. (a) How many commissioned officers of recruiting centres are there; (b) what is the rank, acting or temporary, of each recruiting officer as at March 15, 1941; (c) what is the record of service of the Commanding Officer of each recruiting centre?
