### PRAYERS

Mr. Stollery, from the Standing Committee on Labour, Manpower and Immigration, presented the First Report of the said committee, which is as follows:

Pursuant to its Order of Reference of Tuesday, October 8, 1974, your Committee has considered Bill C-12, An Act to provide for the resumption of grain handling operations on the west coast of Canada, and has agreed to report it without amendment.

A copy of the relevant Minutes of Proceedings and Evidence (*Issues Nos. 1 and 2*) is tabled.

Ordered,—1. That Bill C-12, the Grain Handlers bill be considered at report stage and third reading today when the Orders of the Day are called.

3. That today be regarded as the fifth appointed day of the Address Debate but that if any further amendment is proposed during the Address Debate, the division on it shall be taken at 9:30 p.m. on Tuesday.

Mr. Faulkner, seconded by Mr. Ouellet, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-20, An Act respecting citizenship, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and Recommendation of the Administrator pursuant to Standing Order 62(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Administrator recommends to the House of Commons a measure respecting citizenship to provide for the appointment of citizenship judges and for the remission of fees as prescribed by regulations.

Mr. Whelan, seconded by Mr. Lang, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-21, An Act to amend the Agricultural Products Cooperative Marketing Act, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.
