MEMORANDUM FOR MR. GLASSCO RE MACDONALD COLLEGE

Dean Barton was in yesterday and told me that Professor Bunting had applied for leave of absence until the first of January next on account of ill health. It seems that he is suffering from diabetes and is undergoing Insulin treatment. I assured Barton that we would grant Bunting that leave of absence on pay, and I authorized him to engage a man by the name of Murray to take Bunting's place to be paid at the rate of \$2,800. or \$2,900. per annum.

Barton also informs me that he has engaged Miss Newton in Plant Pathology at a salary of \$2,000. a year, and I understand this appropriation appears in the Budget.

Re Physics - Davies who was with the Byrd Expedition had accepted the position made vacant by the retirement of Quayle, but he now informs us that he is remaining with the U.S. Authorities for some time to complete the records of that expedition. We are filling the position for the time being by Mrs. Chalk, an Honour Graduate of our own and one who has just returned from several years in the Old Country.
