MICA OUTPUT IN THE UNITED STATES.

The production of mica in the United States is one of the important lesser mineral industries; but, altho mica deposits are numerous and well distributed, the imports still exceed the domestic production. According to Douglas B. Sterrett of the United States Geological Survey, the total value of mica produced in the United total value of mica produced in the United States last year amounted to \$355,894, but the imports were valued at \$502,163. These imports, however, were less by \$222,363 than those of 1910.

Mica has a wide commercial application. The most extensive use of sheet mica is in the manufacture of electrical apparatus, but a considerable quantity is still used in the glazing trade for stoves, gas-lamp chimneys, etc. Only the best quality and the larger sheets are available for such purposes, but both large and small sheet mica is used in the electrical industry.


