**FUTURES STILL DRIVEN BY MONEY TIGHTNESS**

Wheat, Corn and Oats Options Decline Again at Chicago—Liverpool is Steady.

World Office, Tuesday Evening, Oct. 29.

Liverpool wheat futures closed 1/4 up, corn unchanged to 1/4 up.

At Chicago, December wheat closed 1/4 lower, December corn 1/4 lower, and

December oats 1/4 lower. Wheat, 107; corn, 107; oats, 107.

Chicago car lots to-day: Wheat, 107; corn, 107; oats, 107.

Winnipeg car lots of wheat to-day, 2 1/4, 1/4 new; last year, 2 1/4.

Duluth, Minn., Oct. 29.—The grain movement to the lakes will be interrupted for the present at least by financial troubles.

At a conference last evening between controllers of the Northern Pacific and Great Northern roads and the directors of the Duluth Board of Trade, an understanding was reported whereby the cars will be handled as rapidly as they can be forwarded.

No trading is being done by the Duluth Board of Trade. The markets have agreed to make no trades until the financial clouds have passed.


