WOMAN OFFICIALS, FALL OUT

Administrator Walsh and Inspector Constantine at Variance.

The Mayor is Coming to Ottawa to Lay His Complaints - William Ogilvie May be the Next Administrator - Ottawa Paper to be Sued for Libel - General News Items from the Capital.

Ottawa, May 1.-Advised received by the Government that Inspector Walsh, Administrator of the Yukon, is on his way to Ottawa and may be expected here in about three weeks. He has no intention of consulting with the Government in regard to vexatious questions of international import, but these in his position to know say this is all poppy-cock. The Mayor has not been on friendly terms with Inspector Constantine, who is in charge of the Mounted Police, and the latter has not hesitated to tell Major Walsh what he thinks of him. The Mayor has been very much annoyed by the remarks of Major Walsh about Inspector Constantine. Major Walsh was for weeks camped at Little Salmon River and every day he stopped at the camp and either to Victoria or Dawson reports of the uncomplimentary observations of the Administrator. Inspector Constantine has been moulded in the same groove as Major Walsh and, consequently, would not put up with insults from the latter. Inspector Constantine, says, has his authority denied. Major Walsh is, accordingly, it is said, coming to Ottawa to get the Government to discipline Inspector Constantine. The general belief is that Major Walsh will not return to the Yukon as Administrator, as it is well known his appointment was only for one year and once he is out of the country the Government may conclude to let him stay out and send a man of fact and judgment like Mr. William Ogilvie.
