HALIFAX GARRISON.

Only Half the Men Sign on for Another Year—Others Given Their Discharge.

Ottawa, March 15.—Only about one-half of the Halifax Provisional Battalion have rejoined for another twelve months. The remainder have been given their discharge.

Of the company of 85 men which has been stationed in British Columbia, only 22 men re-enlisted. The rest were given their discharge. The 22 under the command of Lieut. Col. McKay and Capt. Clarke will return to headquarters at Halifax on Thursday.

DATE OF DEPARTURE UNCERTAIN.

It is not yet known when the recruits for the South African Constabulary will leave here. They may not start until Thursday or Friday, or perhaps Saturday.

Dr. Gorrell of this city, who has been acting medical officer for the force, will accompany it to Halifax. There he will be relieved by Dr. Yank, who will accompany the men to South Africa. Of the 525 men enrolled here only four have been found unfit for duty, and this was on account of ailments which developed after enlistment. Each man has been served with a suit of blue overalls, overcoat and boots, which will last him until he reaches South Africa.
