

PERIOD FOR RETURN OF SERVICE CARDS EXPIRES MARCH 31

Government Extends Time and
Emphasizes Needs.

MAY FORESHADOW ACTION

Taken To Mean That Some-
thing Definite Is To
Follow This.

Although it is possible that the government has not as yet definitely decided to put the matter in force, yet an announcement received today from the War Office, London, indicates that the time for the return of the national service cards has been extended until March 31, and that some definite action will be taken by the government.

The former notice issued in January stated that the cards should be filled in and returned within ten days after their receipt, and that the percentage of the cards were returned, no definite date was set limiting the time allowed for their return, and that the government was not yet ready to take any definite action against those who do not comply with the order.

That some definite action will be taken, a complete list of the names of the country is required, will be taken in the near future is the consensus of opinion among those who are in close touch with the situation.

The following notice was received by Postmaster Macdonald:

NATIONAL SERVICE.
Under authority of the measures act, 1914, it is required that every male between the ages of 16 and 65 years, residing in Canada, should return a national service card within ten days of the receipt thereof.

Any person who has made default in the discharge of this duty is hereby notified that the time for the return of the completed card has been extended until the 31st of March, 1917, and that a national service card and address envelope may be obtained upon application to the nearest postmaster.

Ottawa, February 21, 1917.
To Postmasters and postmistresses:
The national service card is required to be returned to you for your efficient co-operation in distributing and collecting the cards. For this purpose, it has been decided to extend the time within which national service cards may be filled out to March 31 next.

If you have not yet returned your unused cards, will you kindly make use of them by filling them out and returning them to the nearest post office. If you have not yet filled out your card, will you kindly make use of them by filling them out and returning them to the nearest post office.

Last Opportunity.

Postmaster Dr. Macdonald, speaking with regard to the national service card, said, "If anyone has been overlooked who should send in a card, it is well for him to know that the last day has been extended to March 31, and that he can obtain cards."

He was of the opinion that with this additional opportunity, those who do not send in their cards indicates that they do not want to do so, but that a good return. Although 331 extra assistants were employed last month in the work of distributing the cards, it will not be necessary to have any extra help to attend to the few who remain, according to Postmaster Macdonald.

The carriers will simply take a few cards with them and leave them for those who have not returned their cards.

He stated that no special plans have been formulated for the remaining work of the card, but that it is likely that after a consultation with the War Office, some plan will be decided upon, by which the greatest number can best be reached.
