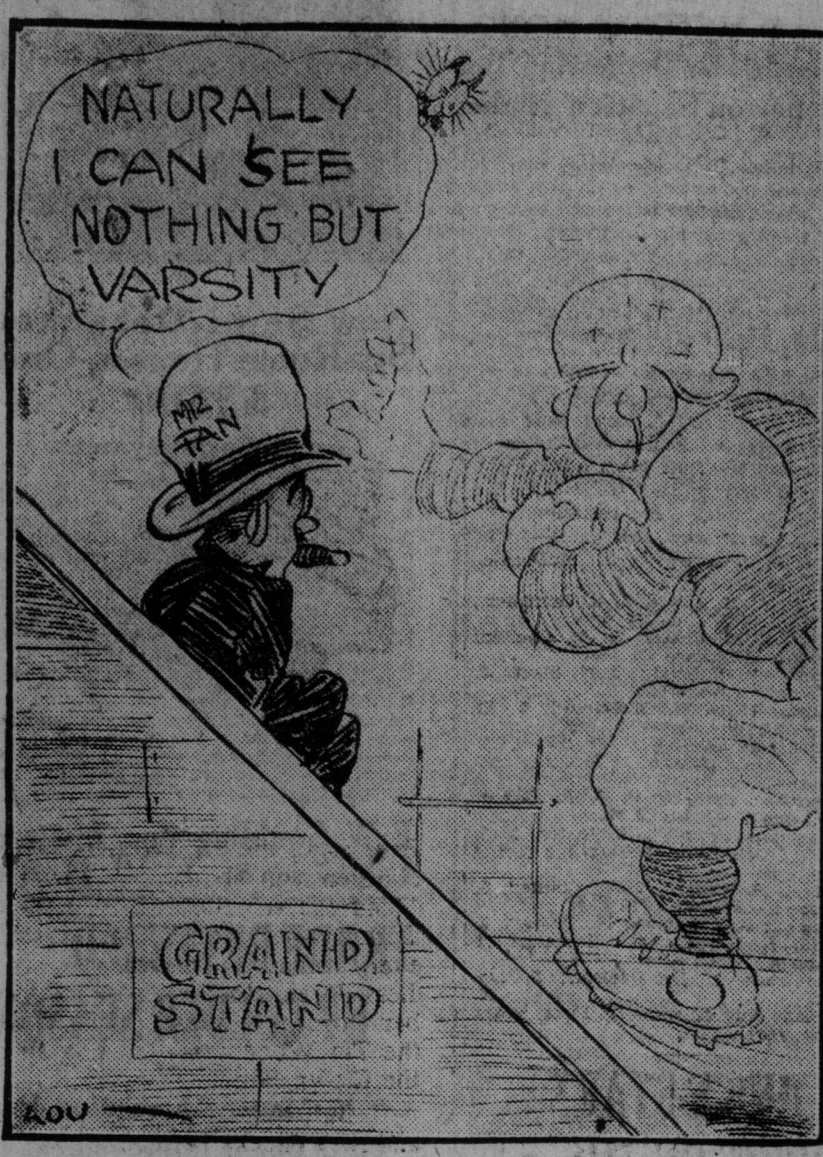

Montreal, Nov. 12.—That the Patriote has grounds for their recent statements that the Alberta Big Four Amateur Hockey League is paying players for their services, seems evident. MAD FOURTH MEMBER APPOINTED TURNKEY

Government Chooses W. H. Symington for Brantford Post—Nixon Implements Promise.

Brantford, Ont., Nov. 12.—(Special).—The appointment was announced today of W. H. Symington, "Mad Fourth" veteran, as turnkey of the county jail, succeeding Turnkey John Cook, promoted governor. The new man will receive a thousand, free house, light, heat and water. Hon. H. C. Nixon thus implemented his promise that a returned man would get the job, have the county council fought hard to have it awarded to the county buildings caretaker, they wanting the veteran to get the janitor's job.
