proceedings, regularly attended all the meetings of the Committee, and contributed liberally to the objects connected with it: and they desire moreover to express their sympathy with his family in their bereavement."

A Sub-Committee was appointed to prepare a memorial to the S. P. G. relative to the claim of the Rev. T. Maynard, Rector of Windsor, for a renewal of his salary from that Society.

May 26, 1865.—The Committee adopted the draft of the 27th Report of the Executive Committee, and ordered the usual number of copies to be printed and issued.

EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF SUB-COMMITTEES.

COMMITTEE UPON PROVISION FOR WIDOWS AND ORPHANS

March 31.—A certificate of pension was granted to the Rev. J. S. Smith, upon the usual terms, viz.: the payment of all back premiums.

Dec. 14, 1864.—An application was made for a pension under the certificate of the Rev. J. Woods, lately deceased at Bermuda. The committee deferred their opinion for want of information.

The Secretary submitted a statement shewing that there was the sum of \$13800 invested for the benefit of this fund, and about \$1000 uninvested.

Jan'y 7, 1865.—The committee came to the unanimous conclusion that the rules laid down by the society for their guidance did not allow them to grant a pension to the orphan of the late Rev. J. Woods, inasmuch as Mr. Woods, by infringing the 11th rule had forfeited his claim.

April 1.—Several clergymen who had omitted to pay their premiums at the appointed time, were re-admitted upon the payment of a fine.
