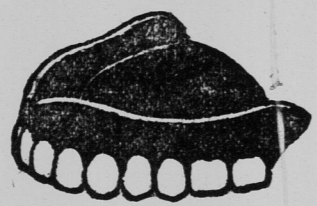

THE ADVANCE IN PRICE OF MILK

Information From Different Points Shows Great Diversity

MONTREAL, Sept. 30.—That the price of milk will be increased shortly seems almost certain, but the position taken up by the purveyors in different places is considered surprising. Montreal dealers threaten to raise the price to ten cents per quart, effective on October 1, and Winnipeg and Kingston are said to be following suit.

Process will also rule higher in the United States, says the New York World. The Sheffield Farms Company will raise their price from eight to nine cents on Oct. 1.
