## ROUSH WINS NATIONAL LEAGUE BATTING HONORS

According to Official Averages Is- sued—Benny Kauff of the Giants Finished Fourth

Eddie Roush, former Giant and Fed- eral Leaguer, had the honor of leading the National League in batting last sea- son. According to the official averages just issued the Cincinnati outfielder bat- ted .341 in 136 games. Roush won his batting crown in his second year in the National League and in the first year that he was used as a regular. Through- out an entire season, Roush is one of the youngest men to win a major league bat- ting championship, being only 24 years old. He is the youngest man to win a batting championship since Ty Cobb won his first American League title in 1907 at the age of 20. The runner-up in the National League was Rogers Hornsby, of the St. Louis Cardinals. Hornsby is only 21 years old. Hornsby, who has been playing big league ball two full seasons and a fraction of an- other, hit .327, a gain of 14 points over his great showing in 1916. Third place goes to the veteran Zack Wheat, of Brooklyn, who hit .318, while Benny Kauff of the Giants, won fourth honors with an average of .308, which was a vast improvement over his performance in 1916. The remaining 200 hitters were Heinie Groh, of the Reds, hitting .304, and George Burns of the Giants, who hit .292. Of the six .300 hitters in the Na- tional League, two are Giants, two are former Giants, and a third has put in his entire big league career in Brooklyn. A group of only six .300 hitters—the smallest colony of .300 hitters the Na- tional League ever has had, seems to be conclusive proof that something should be done to stimulate batting. Year by year the .300 class has dwindled, and this year there are only two men above .318.

Burns, the Giants' leadoff man, had a clear lead in scoring runs, carrying 103 markers over the plate. He had no close rivals, Heinie Groh of the Reds be- ing second with 91 runs. Groh also batted out the greatest number of hits, 182, though he took part in 156 games. Groh had plenty of honors, as he also displayed the most prowess in knocking out two-baggers, getting 30. Hornsby drove out the most three-base hits, 17, while Robertson of the Giants and Cra- vath of the Phillies tied for home run honors, with 12 each. Though Cravath is slipping, he again led in extra bases, his extra base total being 97. Roush and Groh tied for the greatest number of singles, each driving out 111 one base slams. Max Carey of the Pirates led the league in stealing bases, "Scoops" having 40 to his credit. Burns was second with 40 and Kauff was third with 30. Charley Deal of the Cubs laid down the most sacrifice hits—20.



bases and the most triples. The Reds had a team-batting average of .264, which was three points better than the one won by the champion Giants, who were second, with an average of .261. Brooklyn finished fifth in team bat- ting with an average of .247. The Reds secured the greatest number of runs, stole the most bases and had the greatest number of singles and home runs. It is interesting to note that of their thirty-nine home runs eighteen were made on the road, which shows the Giants could crack out homers without aid of their easy Polo Grounds fences. Two hun- dred and forty-four players took part in the 1917 National League campaign, but of these only 170 got into the club. Groh of the Reds played in 156 games, but his club played 157, while Carey of Pittsburgh took part in 155 of the 157 games played by the Pirates.
