

## PRE-MIGRATION TRAINING URGED

Important Developments in  
Empire Settlement Ex-  
pected From Conference

London, Sept. 24.—Developments of an important character with relation to Empire settlement are expected to result from the Imperial Conference, where the question of emigration to the Dominions will be an outstanding feature of the discussions. Full inquiry will be made into the results of the state-aided policy since the Imperial Conference of 1921 and questions relating to the training of intending settlers before leaving Great Britain and

after their arrival in the Dominions will be up for consideration.

The necessity for the preliminary training of men who are to go on the land in the Dominions is being emphasized in many quarters and it is contended that men with the necessary physique and the inclination to engage in agriculture should be given an idea before they sail as to what will be required of them overseas.

A far-reaching proposal is being discussed by officials of the Government and representatives of Canada which has for its object the enlarging of the soldiers' settlement scheme so as to include civilians. This marks an important advance in the emigration policy. The plan is in process of preparation for submission to the Imperial Conference.

Obed Smith, Canadian superintendent of emigration here, seen by a Canadian Press correspondent, spoke of the value of preliminary training. He said: "In the last twenty-five years so many members of the rural population of Great Britain have gone into the towns that it is necessary to go to the large industrial areas for settlers. Reports received show that there are men there who are admirably suited for work on the land."

"Canadian agents in different parts of the country state that fine young men who are eager to go on the land are being held back owing to a lack of training or insufficient knowledge of agricultural requirements in Canada and also held back by the cost of transportation. With these difficulties overcome there would be a pronounced emigration movement."

## DEPORABLE STATE AT FISHING VILLAGE

Records of Halifax Inspector  
Showed Families in Starving Condition.

(Halifax Echo.)

A particularly pitiable state of affairs was discovered yesterday at Terrace Bay, when the county inspector raided two houses, one that of Isadore Cowan and the other that of Mrs. Fannie Slaughter. At Mrs. Slaughter's about twenty gallons of home-made hop beer was found. The county inspector found Mrs. Slaughter, who is a widow, and her seven children ill-clad and in an almost starving condition. They had had nothing to eat since Monday and had no fuel, while their clothes were scanty indeed. He found that this is a state of affairs that prevails in cases at the present time in Terrace Bay, West Dover and other small fishing villages owing to the scarcity of fish.

The people at Terrace Bay have been unable to open a school this year as people are too poor to board a teacher and to pay their school taxes. It was stated that only a very small quantity of fish had been taken at Terrace Bay during the past week, owing to the fact that swarms of dogfish have been cutting the nets. It is stated that the condition of all these fishing people is indeed distressing, while it is also said that in one village all the men have gone to the United States to look for work.

## Who's Who of Women In Canada Planned

Vancouver, B. C., Sept. 25.—Practically doubling its membership since the last triennial convention in Quebec, the Canadian Women's Press Club now numbers 800 members. This healthy sign of progress formed the outstanding feature of the report of the Dominion secretary, Miss Charlotte Whitten, at yesterday's session, and is indicative of the growing entry of women into the journalistic field.

A recommendation by Miss Whitten that the club take steps towards the completion of an accurate and comprehensive "who's who" of Canadian women, commencing with a full roster of members of the club, formed the basis of a resolution which was passed unanimously.

A committee representative of each province was appointed to consider the feasibility of this proposal and to report to a later session.

## SHUBERTS SUE MAGAZINE.

Allege They Were Labeled in an Article in Variety.

New York, Sept. 25.—Lee and Jacob J. Shubert have begun suit in the Supreme Court against Variety, Inc., publisher of the theatrical magazine of that name, for \$100,000 damages, alleging through William Klein, their attorney, that on Aug. 23, 1923, in an article relative to the termination of a contract with Klein brothers, comedians, the defendant libeled them. The article set forth that it cost the comedians \$1,000 to terminate the contract, so that they might go on the Orpheum Circuit without filling out another week. The Shuberts set forth that the story complained of makes it appear that they had acted in a dishonest and good faith in dealing with the team.

## ASKS \$100,000 FOR HIKE.

Pedestrian Says San Diego Mayor Pledged \$1 a Mile in 1915.

San Diego, Cal., Sept. 25.—Henry Stewart, an aged pedestrian, has asked the city of San Diego to pay him \$1 a mile for the 100,000 miles he has walked around the world from city to city. Higgins, City Attorney, asserting that a former Mayor of this city had promised him \$1 a mile for his efforts in advertising the San Diego Exhibition in 1915.

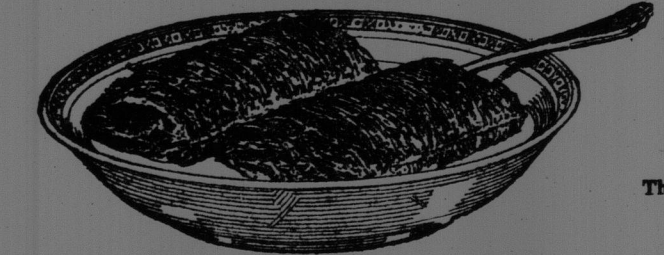
