A NY Person who is the sole head of a family or any made over 18 years old, may homstead a quarter section of available Dominion cland in Mannicola, Sostarchewan, or Afberta, The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion clands agency or sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brocher or sister of intending homesteader.
