

FRENCH LEGISLATION TO PREVENT STRIKES

Paris, Dec. 22—The text of the government measures formulated for the purpose of preventing general strikes, with particular reference to the employes of public service corporations, was made public tonight. The measures constitute a comprehensive plan for ending the strike evil on the railroads and in other public services by means of an organized conciliation commission, composed of representatives of the men and companies. This commission will meet at regular intervals, and when conciliation fails, compulsory arbitration is provided for, the principle being introduced that where the arbitral sentence imposes an additional charge, the corporation can indicate the method whereby the railroad or other service can secure compensation, either by raising the rate or by other means.


To the Editor of The Times:
